



TEAMS THAT WERE READY FOR LIGHT UP NAVAJO II

NTUA had planned to host another year of “Light Up Navajo” in 2020 – based on the outcome of the pilot project that successfully extended electricity to 233 families throughout the Navajo Nation in 2019.

During April and May 2019, a total of 138 volunteers from 28 communities and 13 states traveled to the Navajo Nation to work alongside NTUA linemen to bring electricity to families who have been waiting for many years.

Plans were moving forward for LUN 2020 until the COVID-19 pandemic crossed into the Navajo Nation and postponing the project where approximately 150 electric line workers from public power communities were ready to travel to the Navajo Nation.

“Light Up Navajo was built on teamwork, partnership, and good will,” Haase said. “It is our hope that the utilities that signed up will sign up again to be a part of this meaningful, life changing project.”
